The paper by R. O. Oveh, I. C. Ifediora and F. A. Egbokhare present a representation of the key elements of result processing in higher institutions of learning via domain knowledge. Essentially, the authors discussed the who, what and how of result processing using University of Benin as a case study.

The paper by Essien Idongesit, Ebelogu Christopher Ubaka, M. B. Hammawa and Uwazie Emmanuel Chinanu dwells on identity verification system for Business to Business Export Portal. In it, the authors present a conceptual framework for a hybrid verification system using the Nigerian Export Promotion Council as a case study.

In his paper, Bamidele Oluwade examined the contribution of educated Nigerian traditional rulers towards nation building via management development. This is the latest in the author's series of papers showcasing the contribution of select segments of the Nigerian and international society, especially products of universities, to management development.

The theme of the paper by Temidayo Oluwatosin Omotehinwa, Saeed Igbaoreto Azeez and Ezekiel Olufunminiyi Oyekanmi is on Round Robin (RR) scheduling algorithms for optimal utilization of the resources of the computer's Central Processing Unit (CPU). In it, the authors developed an improved RR CPU scheduling algorithm suitable for asymmetrically distributed burst times.

And last, but in no means the least, R. O. Oveh, I. C. Ifediora and F.A. Egbokhare, in their second paper in this issue, studied the concept of software process knowledge harvest. In the paper, the authors developed a generic framework for knowledge harvest of human level activities.

By this issue, a total of twenty three (23) papers, which passed through rigorous refereeing process, have so far been published in this journal.
